Utter revulsion.

Powerlessness in the face of societal inequality.

Those were the overwhelming sentiments I felt when I was first confronted with the monstrous side of the global sex tourism industry, when I first witnessed a young boy being "bought" in the dingy bars in Chiang Mai's red light district.

He is not alone – with a look at the cold numbers makes for disturbing reading. Over 40 million modern slaves, of which over a fifth are sexually exploited. Approximately USD 99 billion of profit derived from sexual exploitation, with another USD 51 billion from forced economic exploitation. Tackling this nefarious, multi-billion industry seems to be a sheer impossible task.

Yet, Urban Light proves every day that it is possible. That you can bring light into darkness. When I visited Urban Light last year, I saw a house full of laughter and brimming with that special energy and excitement that comes

from a voracious appetite for life. I met Urban Light's staff and was deeply impressed by their professionalism and absolute dedication. I participated in workshops, met some of the boys coming in for help, healthcare, games and many of the other services provided, and shared meals with everyone.

Throughout it, I was immensely touched by everything I witnessed: at Urban Light, the human behind the statistics becomes centerpoint, with all his ups and downs, his joys and sorrows, his tragedies but also his infinite hope. I was left in awe by the work that goes into providing a safe space for boys and men to be able to take a break, and to regain their own sense of strength and ambitions for the time to come. Seeing the work in action has motivated me further to contribute as an international board member, from raising awareness beyond Thai borders to assisting with fundraising and planning for the future.

Only recently, a week filled with meetings, training sessions, fundraising dinners and a drinks & photography fundraising event was organized in Hong Kong to spread the word about Urban Light. I look forward to many more such initiatives and partnerships with likeminded organizations across the globe.

Now, when I think of my visit to Chiang Mai and the work and dedication that Urban Light and its staff and supporters put into helping vulnerable boys and men, it is not utter revulsion and powerlessness that pervades it all; on the contrary, I feel hope, optimism, and a sentiment of deep pride and care for everyone who is touched by Urban Light's efforts and who, through the assistance provided by Urban Light, has regained confidence in their own dignity. I am honored to be part of Urban Light, look forward to many more initiatives and Urban Light's future growth, and am confident that Urban Light and its supporters will continue to be the light for those in need.

Urban Light distinguishes itself not only through the unique services it provides, but, also through the sincerity, integrity and dedication of its team members; each and everyone is truly here for the boys and men whom UL serves. Whether a client is a teenager coming in with a wound, a young man battling mental health issues, or the fathers who are seeking to support their sons, Urban Light addresses it all by attending to injuries, providing counseling services, and offering emergency housing just to name a few of our services. Not to mention Urban Light's achievements in carrying out night outreach

and facilitating the many unsung projects which are happening in local communities, in partnership with the Government sector and with local businesses or the invaluable support we obtain from bilateral donors, local experts and even tourists. Sometimes there are so many plates spinning that it can feel overwhelming – but we are tackling a truly overwhelming task – to overcome human trafficking, to end modern slavery and to put a stop to all other forms of exploitation.

My vision for Urban Light is to see these amazing services expanded, replicated, and evolving with the invaluable input of the clients we serve. I studied my undergraduate degree at Sussex University, a trailblazer in the field of participatory development. I have also spent the last several years of my life learning to read, write and speak in Thai, so that I can facilitate this ambitious process. I would love to see Urban Light expand to other locations in Thailand, to reach more vulnerable, at-risk boys and men – and even to expand to other countries, as the need exists beyond Thai borders. I want to put the most vulnerable

boys, men, and communities in the driver seat empowering them to fight for their rights and for their futures and their children's futures.

Raising awareness alone may not be enough, but it is crucial in order to get things going. Having worked in Asia for for almost 7 years, here's what I can tell you: human trafficking is still happening. It is happening to men. It is happening to boys. It is certainly happening to women and girls, too – I have personally seen it all – but with over 40 million victims of human trafficking globally, and an estimated 29% of those being male, boys and men make up a significant minority that can no longer be overlooked.

We need organizations like Urban Light, which refuse to shut their doors on people who are 'too much trouble', 'too old', 'too difficult' or for whatever reason fall outside our society's embrace. They need a second chance, and they deserve protection and rehabilitation from these horrible crimes. They need community solutions. They need whole societies and international efforts to come together.

That starts with raising awareness and continues with the efforts of not just charities, but governments, businesses, and individuals like yourself.

So please, keep on fighting. Find ways to start conversations, get involved, give your support to victims and the vulnerable, and overcome human trafficking and modern day slavery

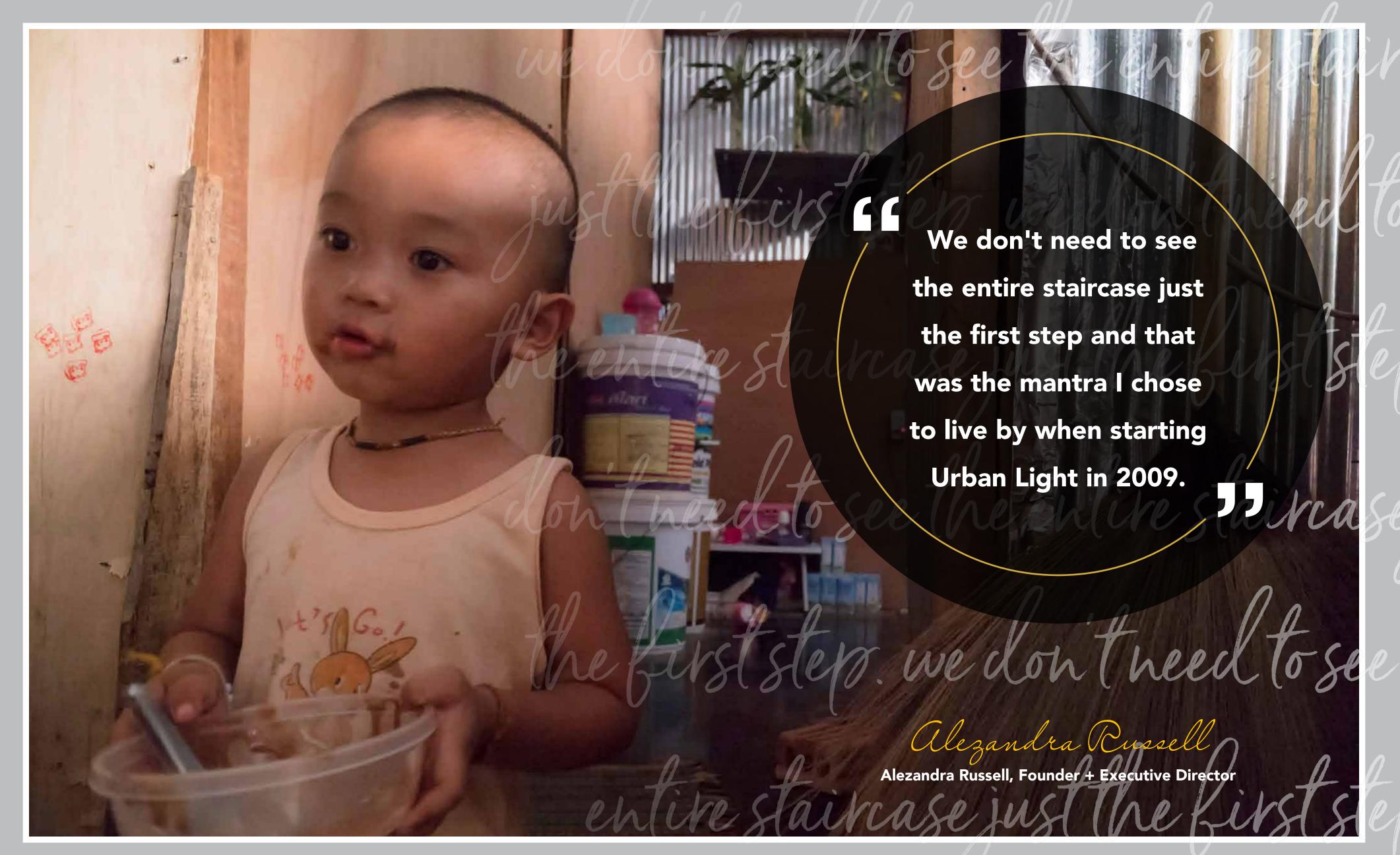

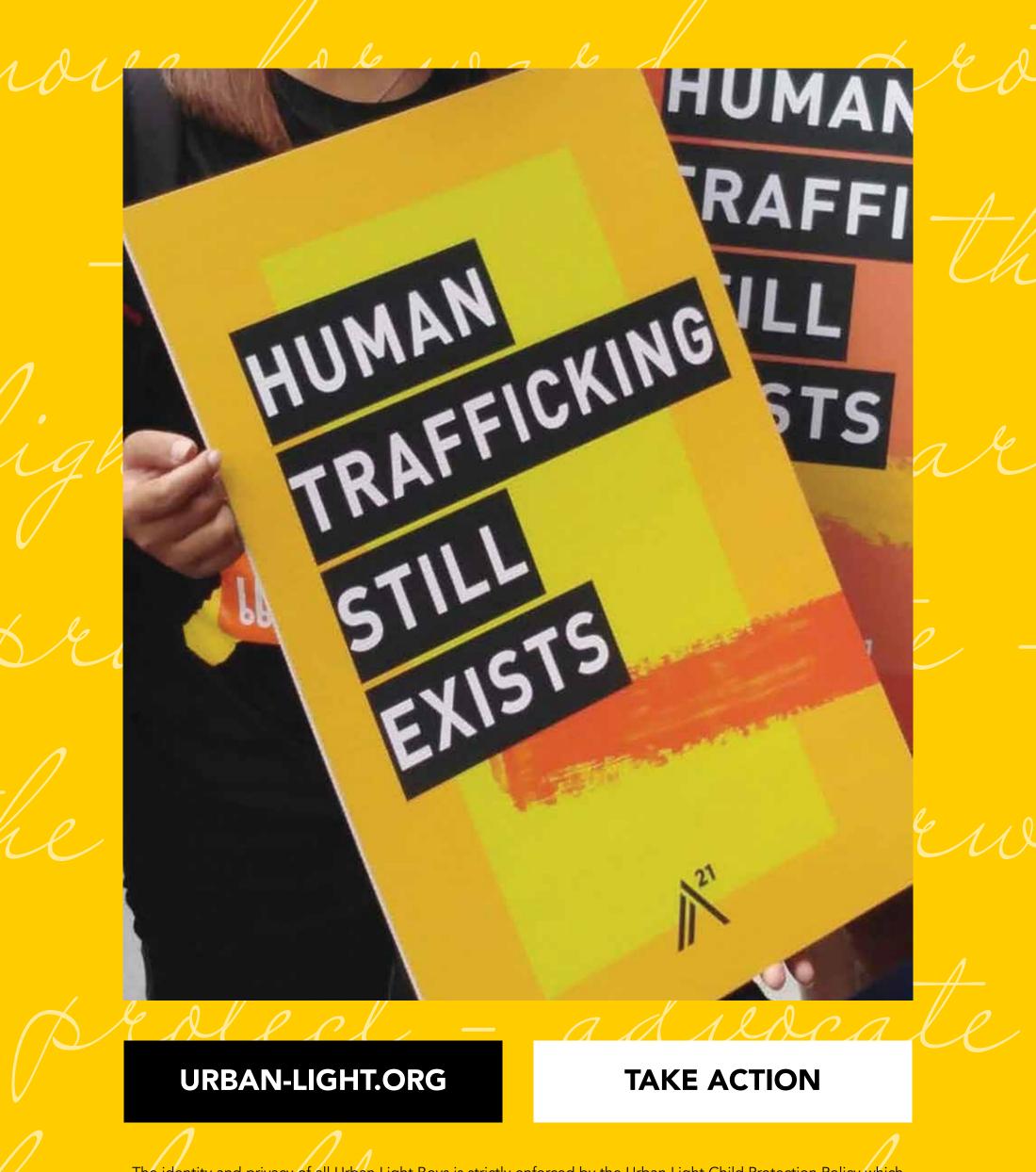
